ANNUAL MEETING

Saint John, N. B., August 27th, 1942.

The Annual Meeting of "The Masonic Grand Lodge Corporation" was held this morning in the Masonic Temple, in the City of Saint John, at eleven o'clock, pursuant to notice given in the Proclamation summoning the Annual Communication of Grand Lodge.

R:W: Bro. R. E. Crawford, Chairman of the Audit Committee, submitted a detailed report as to the Accounts; after the Report had been read a motion was made by R:W: Bro. W. Grant Smith, seconded by W: Bro. C. H. Matthews, and adopted:

"That the Accounts of the V:W: Grand Treasurer be taken from the table; that they and the Report of the Auditors, as printed and in the hands of the brethren, be received and the recommendations of the Auditors be presented to Grand Lodge for consideration; also that they both be presented to Grand Lodge with a view of being printed in the Annual Proceedings." The M:W: Grand Master delivered the following address:—

### GRAND MASTER'S REPORT

#### *Brethren of Grand Lodge:*

It is again my pleasure and privilege to welcome you to an Annual Communication of Grand Lodge; this one, the seventy-fifth since our organization in 1867, an account of which was given by our late R:W: Brother, H. V. B. Bridges, Past Grand Master, in his address in 1917, and which need not be repeated at this time.

It is worthy of note, however, that our fiftieth anniversary, like our seventy-fifth, occurred during a time when our country was at war. A year ago I stated that practically the entire Eastern Hemisphere was a raging battlefield but that the immediate terrors of the strife had not reached our shores. At present there are few countries in either hemisphere that are not in the war, and both of our coasts have been attacked. We must therefore with greater assiduity maintain the teachings of our profession, and show by our words and actions that the peace of the world can be regained and maintained only by living according to the Great Lights in Freemasonry.

To the bereaved, the sympathy of Grand Lodge is most sincerely extended.

During the first week of March, the Grand Secretary and myself met in Saint John with the District Deputy Grand Masters of Districts Nos. 1, 2, 3, 4, 6 and 7. The work of the three degrees and other Masonic ceremonies were gone over and I feel that these officers are fully competent to carry out their

duties in every way. I appreciate the time and effort they are taking to fulfil the requirements of their important office.

Since the duties of a District Deputy Grand Master have become more onerous and exacting, I feel that some appreciation should be shown by this Grand Lodge when these duties have been satisfactorily performed. I, therefore, recommend that after a District Deputy Grand Master has completed four years of such service to the satisfaction of the Grand Master, he shall, upon a favorable vote of Grand Lodge being taken, be entitled to the rank of "Very Worshipful."

It afforded me great pleasure to meet with the Officers and members of these Lodges. Where degree work was conferred or exemplified it was done in a very capable manner. The visit to Keith Lodge No. 23 was for the purpose of installing the Officers, and I wish to express my appreciation of the assistance of the members of the Lodge on that occasion.

The gasoline restrictions and other war conditions prevented visiting other Lodges, which I very much regret, but can confidently report that all Lodges in the jurisdiction are in good condition.

I would recommend that the earnest endeavours of all the brethren be given to the support of their Lodges so that they will continue to be so.

During the year I was called upon to give several opinions regarding Masonic matters, some of which should not have been necessary had the Constitution been more carefully consulted. Two rulings, however, I consider should be recorded. First, permission was asked to allow the acceptance of a petition from a man in his twenty-first year. I ruled that as the Constitution stated that "no person under the age of twenty-one years shall be made a Mason," such permission could not be granted. Second, a Lodge in the jurisdiction received a petition in which the occupation of the petitioner was given as "Leading Stoker Royal Canadian Navy." The Lodge asked if this person could be considered a "sea-faring man" as referred to in Section 2, "Of Proposing Members," page 45 of the Constitution. My ruling was that the occupation given by the petitioner was within the terms of Section 2.

On account of the unusual conditions which now exist because of the war, it might be advisable to have a committee appointed to consider the matter of petitions from members of the armed forces, a report on same to be presented at the next annual communication.

Due to the fact that many of the Officers of our Lodges are engaged in war activities, it has been found impossible to have a degree conferred before the members of Grand Lodge.

On looking over the notices of communications received from Lodges in the jurisdiction, it is found that while they have been received from the majority

of the Lodges, there are some secretaries who send them only occasionally, and a few who send none at all. It is recognized that in some cases it is difficult to secure a member who can devote the necessary time to the duties of secretary, but I would point out that it is now required that all Lodges send notices of all communications to the Grand Master, the Deputy Grand Master, the District Deputy Grand Master, and the Grand Secretary. These notices are necessary to these Officers for the proper carrying out of their duties and must be received by them.

The reports of the Grand Secretary, the Grand Treasurer, and the Auditors will be presented to you and I would ask that they be given your earnest consideration. Last year the loss in membership suggested the possibility of an increase in Grand Lodge dues in order that we should have sufficient funds to carry on. This year there is also a decrease in the number of our members, but fortunately, very slight.

I have, during my visits to the Lodges in the jurisdiction, considered the probable effect of an increase in Grand Lodge dues, and am now of the opinion that any such increase would cause a much larger number of suspensions and withdrawals, and thus have the opposite effect to that intended. Any increase in Grand Lodge dues would necessarily cause an increase in the dues of the individual member and thus make it more difficult for him to retain his membership. With the ever-increasing taxes which we are required to pay in order to preserve our liberty and defeat our enemies, I do not consider it would be in the interests of the craft to increase our Grand Lodge dues at the present time.

This means that some other way should be used

to improve our financial condition, and for that reason I have carefully examined the receipts and expenditures of Grand Lodge General Account, as well as the Fund of Benevolence.

The expenditures of the General Account may be classed in four parts: Grand Secretary's salary, the Grand Master's and the District Deputy Grand Masters' expenses, general expenses, and rent.

Grand Lodge expressed an opinion at the last Annual Communication regarding the Grand Secretary's salary. The Grand Master's and the D. D. G. M.s' expenses are voted by Grand Lodge. The general expenses are passed on by the Board of General Purposes.

When the Masonic Temple was rebuilt in 1930-31, a lease was entered into with the owners, The Saint John Masonic Temple Limited, for rooms consisting of a Grand Secretary's office, Library and Lobby, and the use of the main Lodge room for the communications of Grand Lodge, for a period of ten years at a rental of \$1,500.00 per annum. This lease has now expired and the rooms are being occupied on a year-to-year basis. While Grand Lodge was at that time in a position to pay a yearly rental of \$1,500.00, it certainly is not at the present time. The location and the arrangement of the rooms are ideal for Grand Lodge purposes, but from a business point of view, what amounts to practically one-third of our revenue is too much to pay for rental of a place in which to do that business. Grand Lodge must put its finances on a sound basis. We do not know what the future has in store for us, and at present our receipts and expenses are too close to each other. I would therefore recommend that a committee of three be appointed to arrange for a rental more in accord with

our finances, such arrangements to be approved by Grand Lodge.

The Fund of Benevolence was originally created from various amounts taken at different times out of Grand Lodge Current Account for the purpose of having a fund from which to extend relief to Masons, their widows and orphans. The assets of this fund are now \$81,500.00 in bonds and the annual interest from the same is about \$4,000.00. The expenditures (or grants) which are paid out of the interest received annually from these bonds amounted this year to \$1,050.00, leaving a cash balance on hand of \$3,024.70. It has been the custom each year to invest these balances in additional bonds and thus increase the assets of this fund. In view of the present condition of our General Account, and in order to relieve the financial strain on the brethren in our jurisdiction, I would recommend that the sum of \$500.00 each year be transferred from the unexpended cash balance of the Fund of Benevolence to the General Account for the period of two years (1942 and 1943); also that for a period of ten years thereafter the sum of two hundred dollars be so transferred each year.

I would also recommend that a committee of three be appointed each year for the purpose of examining the annual reports received from other Grand Lodges, and reporting to this Grand Lodge such matters which they consider may be of interest to us.

I desire before closing to express my appreciation of the assistance given to me by the officers and members of Grand Lodge during my term of office. My pleasant association with the members of the Craft will be long remembered.

I would also ask all Secretaries to be careful in making out their Annual Returns to be sure to include the full name of all new members thereon. It saves time in making out the certificates.

Insurance policies, covering insurance on Grand Lodge Regalia, \$2,500.00; Oil Paintings, etc., \$4,800.00, and Bond of V:W: Grand Secretary, \$4,000.00, were produced and verified.

The Bonds held in the safety deposit box, Bank of Nova Scotia, to the amount of \$81,500.00 have been examined and found to be in order.

The Cash Balances in the Bank of Nova Scotia to the credit of the General Account and Fund of Benevolence have been verified by the Bank Officials.

We find that all Lodges but three have paid amounts due

Grand Lodge. Outstanding \$468.25, of which \$328.00 is fees and dues, and \$140.25 dispensation and merchandise.

It is noted by your Audit Committee that their recommendation of last year with respect to increasing the income of General Account has not been implemented and we would again recommend that General Account Income be seriously considered by Grand Lodge.

We find that the fixed charges for the balance of the year exceeds the present bank balance, plus outstanding accounts, by some hundreds of dollars and this should be overcome immediately.

There are, in our opinion, two methods of augmenting General Account; (1), by increasing the per capita, or, (2), by transferring from the balance of the Fund of Benevolence interest account sufficient monies, over a period of years to supplement the deficiency.

This latter method will place us in a more stable financial position during this period of high taxes and rising costs and obviate an increase in per capita, which would necessitate increased subordinate lodge dues. This we feel would mitigate against us in the long run.

The sections of the Constitutions of the Grand Lodge of New Brunswick relating to the election of officers was ordered to be read, after which the M:W: Grand Master appointed R:W: R. Donald Stewart, J. H. Crockett, A. C. Lemmon and J. E. Collings as scrutineers, who were accordingly pledged.

On written nomination and ballots cast, R:W: James Stanley Hoyt was elected Most Worshipful Grand Master and was declared accordingly amid much applause.

Also on written nomination and ballots cast in each case, the Scrutineers reported that the following Brethren had received the majority of all the votes cast, in each instance, and they were severally declared duly elected:—

R:W: Brother J. Fred Edgett presented and read the Report of the Special Committee on the Address of the Grand Master and, on motion duly seconded, the report was received and approved and the recom-

mendations therein were adopted and the report was ordered to be printed in full in the Proceedings of Grand Lodge.

*To the M:W: Grand Master, Officers and Members of Grand Lodge:*

The Special Committee to whom was referred the Address of the Grand Master beg to submit their report thereon.

Your Committee wishes to congratulate the M:W: Grand Master on the completion of another year of conscientious effort, and feel that the thanks and appreciation of Grand Lodge are due him for his leadership and the time devoted to the interests of the Craft.

Your Committee notes with pride that this Communication records the completion of seventy-five years of Masonic activity and joins with the Grand Master in his hope that the occasion may stimulate greater zeal in us all to live by the Great Lights of Freemasonry.

We note your reference to the continuation and spread of the present world conflict which overshadows all our activities and calls upon all our reserves of courage and sacrifice. This should make us cherish still closer the bulwark of Masonry as providing a source of strength for the days that lie ahead until victory is finally achieved.

We join with the Grand Master in his expression of regret at the death of so many prominent and reputed members of the Craft since our last Communication.

We recommend the adoption of the Grand Master's suggestion that a committee of three be ap-

pointed to examine other Grand Lodge Annual Reports and bring to this Grand Lodge any useful data they may discover.

We concur in the Grand Master's recommendation that a District Deputy Grand Master completing four years of satisfactory service shall be entitled, upon the vote of Grand Lodge, to the rank of "Very Worshipful."

The Committee sees no objection to the appointment of a committee to consider the matter of petitions from members of the armed forces.

Your Committee regrets to learn that the annual income of Grand Lodge is not sufficient to meet the general expenditure and agree that it is necessary to either increase the income or retrench in expenditure. After carefully considering all phases of the problem your Committee feel that the financial well-being of the Craft throughout the jurisdiction can best be served during the present time by recommending that notice be given at this Communication of Grand Lodge to alter the Constitutions at the next Annual Communication of Grand Lodge respecting the "Fund of Benevolence" by making it permissible for Grand Lodge to order that an amount not exceeding twenty-five per centum of the unexpended balance of income of the fund in any year be transferred to the credit of the Grand Lodge General Account.

The Trowel used by the late James Vroom, Past Grand Master, to lay the cornerstone of Colebrooke Lodge No. 39, Grand Falls, N. B., was presented to Grand Lodge by his daughter, Miss Vroom of Frederickton, with a request that it be presented to that Lodge at the first convenient opportunity.

A Veterans' Jewel presented by the Grand Lodge of Minnesota to the late Past Grand Master Vroom was also handed to Grand Lodge and it was ordered to be placed in the Archives,

Deep sympathy was expressed in the very sudden demise of the Duke of Kent, M:W: Grand Master of the United Grand Lodge of England and it was ordered that a letter of regret be sent to His Majesty the King, to the Royal widow, the Duchess of Kent, and to the Mother Queen Dowager, Queen Mary, and also to the United Grand Lodge of England.

Grand Lodge now took recess for a period of fifteen minutes to allow for the preparation for the installation of the Most Worshipful Grand Master.

Grand Lodge was called on at nine forty-five o'clock and proceeded to the installation of the Grand Master.

R:W: LeB. Wilson, Senior Past Grand Master, assumed the Grand East, taking the duties of Installing Officer.

M:W: James Stanley Hoyt was invested and installed Most Worshipful Grand Master of the Antient and Honourable Fraternity of Free and Accepted Masons of New Brunswick and was so proclaimed from the South, West and East, amid applause from the assembled Brethren.

The several other Officers present were likewise invested and installed by the Grand Master, M:W: James S. Hoyt, and were conducted to their respective offices by the Grand Director of Ceremonies.

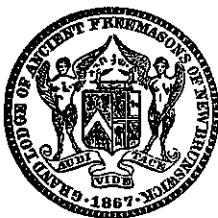

I have the honour to submit my report as your District Deputy Grand Master for District No. 1.

With Grand Lodge officers, I had the pleasure of accompanying the Most Worshipful Grand Master when he visited Saint Martins Lodge No. 30 on November 10th of last year. The work was creditably performed and a social hour spent at the conclusion of the degree. This Lodge is forced to suspend during the winter months owing to the impassibility of the roads; but during the remaining months it is one of the most active Lodges in the District, despite the fact that its members are widely dispersed. Its financial condition is excellent and its membership is increasing steadily.

As a Grand Lodge representative, I attended the installation ceremony of Carleton Union Lodge No. 8 on December 27th, and had the pleasure of accompanying the Deputy Grand Master at the installation of the Masters and officers of the following Lodges:—

- January 6th—St. John's No. 2.
- January 8th—New Brunswick No. 22.
- January 13th—Hibernia No. 3.
- January 20th—Union Lodge of Portland No. 10.

I visited Carleton Union Lodge officially on February 5th and witnessed the conferring of the Fellow Craft Degree in their usual excellent manner. On March 5th I had the pleasure of seeing the same candidates raised, when I accompanied the Most Worshipful Grand Master on his official visit to this Lodge. On both of these occasions, entertainment and refreshments were bountifully provided by the brethren of the Lodge.

St. John's Lodge No. 2 initiated four candidates on my visit to them February 3rd, the Worshipful Master and officers capably upholding the reputation of the Lodge for fine work.

On invitation of Union Lodge of Portland on May 19th I attended the one hundredth anniversary of the inception of the Lodge. This event was attended by other Grand Lodge officers as well as officers of the nearby Lodges who came in a body to extend congratulations. The communication was extremely colorful and impressive.

The degree work of the various Lodges in the District is of a very high standard, particularly in the Saint John City area, where the Lodges vie with each other in putting on perfect ritual. These Lodges formerly had the advantage of mutual instruction and easy access to authoritative correction, but owing to the interest and energy of Past Grand Master, Guy H. Humphrey, all Lodges, both rural and urban, should now be in a position to do just as good work if the officers will apply themselves.

All Lodges are finding it difficult to select good officer material, and I would suggest that incoming Masters carefully review the qualifications of some of the older members of the Craft who are ineligible for

military service. The war is a war of youth—Freemasonry must still survive.

I also feel that a great many Lodges are missing a golden opportunity to advance the Craft in not being more energetic in contacting members of the Order who are in the armed forces stationed near their Temples. In each unit there are many Masons, probably lonely ones, who hesitate to approach the door of a strange Lodge uninvited, yet are ready, if the need arises, to make any sacrifice that our customs and our landmarks shall remain unmolested. Are we doing OUR part?

May I in closing thank you, sir, for the honour bestowed on me in selecting me as your representative in this District, and may I also express to the brethren of this District my heartfelt thanks for the many courtesies extended and the considerations shown that made my tenure of office so enjoyable.
