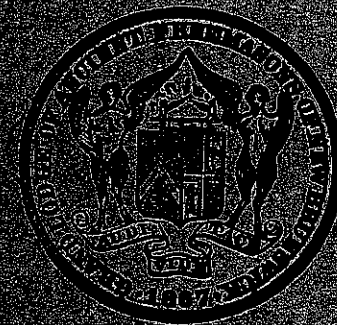

"APPLES OF GOLD IN PICTURES OF SILVER"

Text: "A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver." (Proverbs 25:11)

Jerry Lewis, the wellknown comedian of many movies and T.V. shows says he once paid \$25,000. for four words and they were a bargain! It appears that he had been in failing health and he went to one specialist after another to find out what was affecting his health. He eventually went to one medical specialist who diagnosed his condition with 4 words . . . he was to "Avoid, CONSTANT, UNRELENTING PRESSURE!"

There is a **power** of the tongue to **help people**. A word that needs to be spoken is the one that helps to put men on their feet when they are walking in slippery places. The world is full of defeated souls. Many live in good houses, wear good cloths, and are accepted in society. **BUT inwardly** they are confused and beaten, and their existence is a sort of make believe. These people need to hear some word from Masons that will put them on their feet and you as Masons have that word!

The power of words fitly spoken are great but also the power of ill-advised speech is also great and can do great harm. During the war years you read posters with the words "IDLE TALK COST LIVES!"

The rule of silence enforced by the Trappist monks is a searching comment on the power of ill advised speech . . . to do injury. Words are the ambassadors of the soul!

It was said of Martin Luther that his words were so powerful they were like battles.

"Religion, freedom, vengence, what you will . . . A word's enough to raise mankind to kill."

Likewise, a word is enough to hold mankind back from killing and to inspire him to noble thinking and glorious living.

May we as Masons use words which shall have a sweet echo yonder in the Great Day of Judgment:

- words which have blessed and not cursed
- words which have helped and not hindered
- encouraged and not discouraged
- heartened and not disheartened
- increased and not diminished men's faith in man and in God
- words, which have brightened and not dimmed the hopes of man for life here and life in the Temple above.

Can't you picture the wise Solomon grasping for some figure of speech that would aptly compare "A word fitly spoken . . . is like what? . . . then he wrote these picturesque words . . . A word fitly spoken is like apples of gold in pictures of silver". When our Master walked the dusty paths of The Holy Land He spoke on many different occasions "A word fitly spoken":

THERE IS THE WORD OF "COMFORT" he spoke to the widow of Nain who had great cause for sorrow. She was a widow and now her only son was dead. The funeral procession was making its way down the streets of that city when our Master and His disciples came by. And when He saw her He had compassion and he said to her in modern English . . . "Cheer up, mother, I'll do what I can to comfort you". Our Master touched the casket and he said unto the young man, I say unto thee arise. "And he that was dead sat up and began to speak".

During the years I have been a Mason, I have had the privilege of seeing how the Masons of New Brunswick speak the word of Comfort to the widow of brother Masons and take time off work and other engagements to express their word of Comfort like our Master did here on earth. As Masons let us continue to speak the word of comfort. We can find help and strength as we read the Holy Scriptures upon which our Order is founded.

"I opened the old, old Bible, And looked at a page of Psalms . . . Till the wintry sea of my trouble Was soothed as by summer calms; For the words that have helped so many, And the ages have made more dear, Seemed new in their power to comfort As they brought me their word of cheer."

THERE IS THE WORD OF "UNDERSTANDING": Our Master was confronted with a woman taken in adultery. She had been brought before Him by the Scribes and Pharisees . . . to ask our Master to be her judge. "Now Moses in the Law commanded us, that such be stoned. But what sayest Thou? This they did to tempt and trap the Master. The Master stooped down and with his finger wrote on the ground, as though He heard them not." *They kept asking Him, He said "He that is without sin among you, let him first cast a stone at her."* Here indeed were words fitly spoken . . . words of understanding. We as Masons need to have words of understanding with those who fall along the journey of life. As the poet wrote: "Pray, don't find fault with the man who limps . . . Or stumbles along the road; Unless you have worn the shoes he wears, Or struggled beneath his load. Don't be too harsh with the mason who sins, Or pelt him with words or stones; Unless you are sure, yea, doubly sure . . . That you have no sins of your own."

**OUR MASTER SPOKE THE WORD OF . . .
"APPRECIATION"**

While He was eating at the home of a Pharisee who had invited Him to meat, that a woman in the city, which was a sinner, when she knew that the Master sat at meat in the Pharisees house, brought an alabaster box of ointment and stood at his feet behind Him weeping and began to wash his feet with tears, and did wipe them with the hairs on her head, and kissed his feet, and anointed them with oil". Our Master showed His **appreciation** unto her and rebuked Simon for the coldness of his love for the Master. "Her sins which are many are forgiven; for she loved much". He said to the woman, "Thy faith hath saved thee, go in peace."

This woman from the red-light district of that city hath done what she could. She wanted to be forgiven . . . she brought the box of ointment . . . her only way of showing her love.

Masons are encouraged to speak the word of **appreciation** to all who assist them in the work of the lodge and to show their appreciation in a tangible way for a needy brother Mason, his widow or orphan. Masons give their support for the work of their own lodge and other Masonic lodges that need brotherly assistance.

May this proverb from the lips of Solomon encourage us as Masons to speak the word of **COMFORT . . . THE WORD OF UNDERSTANDING AND THE WORD OF APPRECIATION** . . . not only in Masonic circles but in the arena of everyday life.

TO THE GRAND LODGE OF FREE AND ACCEPTED MASONS OF NEW BRUNSWICK:

Three meetings of the Board have held during the year. At this first meeting in June, Right Worshipful Ralph V Limerick, Senior Grand Warden was elected Vice-President, Right Worshipful J Garth Girvan, Deputy Grand Master presiding.

The Board approved the expenditure of an amount not to exceed \$6000.00, to be allotted for the Scholarship Committee.

The revised edition of the Constitution and General Regulations was approved for 1500 copies at cost price of \$1.00 per copy.

The Committee on Masonic Culture and Information were authorized to provide a recommended revised funeral service and proposed brochure, "Freemasonry a Way of Life".

In November 1972, it was found necessary to provide an assistant to the Grand Secretary, due to the ill health of Miss Roberts. The services of Mrs Verda Demmings have been satisfactorily achieved.

Notification of increase in rent, for Grand Lodge quarters, from the Saint John Masonic Temple Ltd effective January 1, 1973. The increase of \$1200.00 per year was approved. Other tenants and Masonic bodies involved were correspondingly affected to provide sufficient funds for increased expenses and maintainance of the property.

Proposed ammendments of the Constitution and General Regulations have been submitted to the Board and recommended for the consideration of the Grand Lodge.

ANNUAL REPORT OF GRAND HISTORIAN

To the Most Worshipful The Grand Master
Officers and Members of
The Grand Lodge of New Brunswick
Free and Accepted Masons

The Fraternity and their immediate families have been stricken during the last year by death. To all who have sustained such a loss, we extend sympathy and understanding.

Highlights in the year, as in 1971-72 focuses upon Westmorland, Lodge No. 44 of Port Elgin, N.B. It will be recalled that following the Halow'een fire of 1971 that severely gutted the lodge building, no furniture or regalia was lost or destroyed. Everything had to be removed from the building and was laid out to be partially dried in the sunlight and not knowing where to store these articles or where to find new temporary lodgings for the Craft, two members of the Catholic faith played an important role at this time. One of these gentlemen suggested to a Mason brother that they should contact Rev. Father Alfred Maillet regarding use of one of the buildings belonging to the R. C. Church. Upon being approached Rev. Father Maillet gave his immediate and cheerful consent. With the help of Masons and non-masons alike, the lodge furnishings were transferred to Saint Clement's school that had been vacant for a number of years. Westmorland Lodge No. 44, A. F. & A. M. held their communications from Nov. 1, 1971 to August 31, 1972 while the new temple was being built.

On Sunday, June 11, 1972, Masons from throughout the Maritimes joined with those of Westmorland Lodge No. 44 to observe the traditional sod turning ceremony for their new \$20,000. Temple.

Their new building is located on Church Street adjacent to the United Church and is a multi-purpose structure measuring 55 x 34 feet.

Most Worshipful Maurice Wm. Dalton, Grand Master of Free and Accepted Masons of N.B., conducted the sod turning ceremonies and was assisted by past master Wendell Scott of West Point, Prince Edward Island, a life member of Westmorland Lodge who drove the ceremonial bronze spade into the turf in the symbolic rite. Very Worshipful Gordon MacLeod, Grand Chaplain, gave the invocation.

Following the ceremony attended by over 100 Masons representing lodges in the three Provinces, marched to the Trinity United Church for a service conducted by Rev. Keith Rogerson, Chaplain of Westmorland Lodge.

During the summer months that followed, construction work progressed at a rapid pace, much of the labor and material was given voluntarily by members and friends thus making possible the erection of a large building at a minimum cost.

Sunday, October 15, 1972 marked another historic occasion with the Laying of the Cornerstone of Westmorland Lodge and for the first time this ceremony was open to the public as well as to the brethren and their wives. Ceremonies were conducted by the Most Worshipful Grand Master, Maurice Wm. Dalton, assisted by Most Worshipful the Grand Secretary, A. C. Lemmon and thirty Grand Lodge officers.

A number of distinguished guests were escorted to the East by the Grand Director of Ceremonies including Rev. Father Maillet, Parish Priest. In appropriate recognition for his splendid cooperation, Father Maillet was invited to participate in the dedication ceremonies by reading a lesson from the Holy Scriptures and in an address to the Throne of Grace.

Wor. Br. Austin Oulton, Chairman of the Building Committee, was conducted to the East to inform the Most Wor. Gr. Master M. W. Dalton on behalf of the officers and brethren of Westmorland Lodge that he now lay the cornerstone. A list of documents were read which were to be placed behind the cornerstone including a brief history of the Lodge from 1921 up to the date of the 50th Anniversary; a list of the building Committee and officers for 1972.

Following the laying of the cornerstone, the Architect, Wor. Bro. Sherman McKay was conducted to the East to be presented to the M. W. Gr. Master who presented Wor. Bro. McKay with the John Beardsley Medallion.

Space does not permit details of other activities. A guest Book was presented to Westmorland Lodge by Lebanon Lodge No. 28 of Sackville.

A 50 year medal was presented to Brother Thomas Miller and a bouquet of roses to Mrs. Miller.

Past Grand Master E. L. Eaton of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia spoke to the assembly. Also Rev. Father Maillet who spoke fittingly upon the subject of harmony, brotherly love with emphasis upon the burial of old prejudices.

Fort Monckton Chapter of the Eastern Star catered to those present with over 200 in attendance for this historic occasion.

It is understood Dedication Ceremonies for Westmorland Lodge No. 44 will take place on April 27, 1973 following submission of this report.

Something of a record was achieved on January 13, 1973 at a joint installation of officers of Tweedie Lodge No.41 and Acadia Lodge No. 49 of Moncton when the ceremonies were conducted by the Most Worshipful Grand Master, assisted by officers of Grand Lodge when a record attendance saw 93 past masters present for this occasion.

Another record of note occurred at the Annual Meeting of the Masonic Grand Lodge Corporation held on May 13, 1972 when nine (9) Past Grand Masters were present and were warmly greeted by applause and a standing ovation.

During the past year a considerable number of brethren were presented with bars, jewels or certificates marking their long service careers. This list of members is given in the Report of the Grand Master.

During the past year correspondence has been held with the Grand Historian of the Grand Lodge of Nova Scotia and other Masonic sources.
